

THE RAIL TRAIL: A PAVED BIKING AND WALKING PATH

DAVENPORT TO WATSONVILLE



The Rail Trail offers access to many popular destinations in Santa Cruz County for those biking and walking. The five sections below that are underway represent 13 miles of the 32 mile total length of the Rail Trail. More sections will be added as Measure D funds and grants become available. The Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission is the lead agency for the Rail Trail and is working in partnership with implementing agencies. For further information visit scrtc.org.

The 5 sections of Rail Trail **UNDERWAY** illustrated below are numbered in the order they will likely be constructed. Listed opening dates are estimates provided by the RTC.

- 1 Westside Santa Cruz: Open 2018**
 Connects: Natural Bridges Drive to Pacific Avenue and the Santa Cruz Wharf
 Distance: 2.1 miles
- 2 San Lorenzo River Crossing: Open 2019**
 Connects: Widens existing path for use by bikes and pedestrians
- 3 Watsonville, Lee Road: Open 2019**
 Connects: Lee Road to Walker Street
 Distance: 1.2 miles
- 4 North Coast, Wilder Ranch: Opens 2021**
 Connects: Davenport to Wilder Ranch State Park parking lot
 Distance: 7.5 miles
- 5 Santa Cruz Wharf to 17th Ave.: Open 2024**
 Connects: Santa Cruz to Live Oak
 Distance: 2.2 miles
